By beginning so early, he knows that he has plenty of time

to do his work thoroughly. He does not have to hurry over any part of his work. He gets to sleep long before midnight. At that time sleep is most refreshing. After a night's sound rest, he rises early next morning in good health and ready for the labour of a new day.

(b) There was a time when all homework was done by the women and girls of the household. Few husbands ever dreamt of washing up, preparing breakfast or feeding the baby! Such duties were no concern of theirs. Any normal

school boy assumed that if help were needed in the home, his sisters would be called on to give it, and the whole family supported the view that the males should not or could not clean, mend, wash, cook or make beds.

Things are very different today. Doctors or Barristers find nothing undignified or shameful in putting on an apron to help in the kitchen or nursery and washing of dishes of the household or personal linen. The school boy is more often than formerly expected to help his mother. One reason for the change is the shortage of domestic servants. Girls could once be found to do the hard work in middle and upper class homes for very moderate wages, such girls can now-a-days earn in factories in a short working day more money than most householders can afford to pay. Thus, the wife now does the house-work herself with the aid of labour-saving equipment ; and she expects some help from her husband.

When the Royal Navy brought piracy to an end in the China Seas in 1873, it formed a fitting conclusion to seventy years of this illegal seafaring activity in our history, for this was the last region of the globe to be made safe for trade. Throughout the history of piracy, from the rovers of the middle ages, through the exploits of the Elizabethan adventurers and the fantastic success of men like John Avery in the Indian Ocean, down to the notorious operations in the Mediterranean in the last century, one thing has been made plain—that without an adequate naval force to

guard the seas piracy will always flourish, and that once piracy has the upper hand those who assist it and share the booty will stop at nothing to evade the law. Although petty piracy still occurs from time to time in the Eastern Seas, the Persian Gulf and the Caribbean Sea, it causes less trouble to traders in these waters than pedestrians suffer from pickpockets in a busy city shopping thoroughfare. To-day no pirate, branded as he is by international law as a common enemy of every nation, could hope to escape detection and destruction within a short time of making an attack. Powerful national navies and air forces, with the assistance of modern devices such as wire-less telegraphy, are well equipped to keep the peace at sea. Piracy now offers too little returns for the great dangers involved. The real modern successors to the line of outrageous captains who terrorize the merchant fleets of the world are no longer pirates, but the gun-runners of the Middle East, the kidnapping gangs of America, and the bank raiders of Britain.
