- 1. Answer the following questions:  $10 \times 2 = 20$ 
  - (i) Has the Civil Court power to grant injunction against the Central or State Government or any Officer of such Government without notice to the Government under the Essential Commodities Act, 1955?



- (ii) For violation of the order made under section 3 of Essential Commodities Act, 1955 by a public servant, is it necessary to obtain previous sanction of the Government for prosecution of such public servant?
- (iii) An instrument has been admitted in evidence.

  Can it be called in question at any stage of the suit on the ground that it has not been duly stamped?
- (iv) Can a document requiring a stamp under the Court Fees Act, 1870 be filed or acted upon in any proceeding in any Court or Office until the stamp has been cancelled?
- (v) Is 'jute seed' an essential commodity within the meaning of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955?
- (vi) Namita, a young girl, 16 years old, drives a motor cycle with engine capacity of 50cc in a public place. Does she commit any office?
- (vii) Is the Pound-keeper a public servant within the meaning of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871.
- (viii) A Sale Deed required to be stamped by law, but was not duly stamped. Is it admissible in evidence in Court?

- (ix) A cultivator, while damaging his crop, seizes cattle which were resisted by the cattle owner. The cultivator seeks aid of the police who refused to advance such aid. Has the police violated the provisions of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871?
- (x) Is a bomb falls within the meaning of 'ammunition' as provided in the Arms Act, 1959?
