- (i) Has a Police Officer power without the order of a Magistrate and without a warrant of arrest to cause arrest of a person against whom credible information has been received that he has committed a cognizable office punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to seven years?
- (ii) Is the 'note in file', maintained by a Public Officer for performance of his public duties, a public document?
- (iii) A girl, aged 15 years, was subjugated to give her consent for having sexual intercourse with a man. Does it amount giving consent by the girl?
- (iv) A committed an offence punishable under section 147 of the Indian Penal Code which is cognizable. Can a police officer, investigating the case, grant bail on his arrest?
- (v) The officer-in-charge of a police station received information that a person committed suicide. Immediately after that he proceeded to the place of

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occurrence for making investigation without sending any information to the Executive Magistrate. Has the police officer committed any breach of law?

- (vi) Is a tree, standing on the land being attached to earth, a movable property?
- (vii) Is the possession of clerk, temporarily appointed, can be considered as possession of the employer within the meaning of the Indian Penal Code?
- (viii) In the presence of an Executive Magistrate within his local jurisdiction an offence is committed by Mr. X. Whether the Executive Magistrate himself can arrest or order the arrest of Mr. X and commit him to custody?
- (ix) An Executive Magistrate of Udaipur Sub-Division received information that one person Mr. P is likely to commit the breach of peace at Rajnagar within the jurisdiction of Belonia Sub-Division. Has the Executive Magistrate of Udaipur Sub-Division jurisdiction to proceed against Mr. P under section 107 of Cr. P C, 1973?
- (x) Can a member of the public lodge complaint against a person for violation of prohibitory order under section 144 of CrPC, 1973 punishable under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code?
